The eating habits of our region are based on the Mediterranean diet. This diet includes olive oil, bread, pasta, rice, fruit, legumes and vegetables. It frequently includes grilled and steamed fish and small portions of red meat. However, nowadays it is affected from the American type of food, the "fast food" which is unfortunately popular harmony young people. Traditional drinks of my region are wine and "tsipouro". These drinks are alcoholic and their production is a mini celebration. There are also festivals for these drinks and not only for these drinks but also for fruits. They also entertain themselves under the sounds of traditional music and watch traditional dances.

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
